Galatians 2:4-5

"But this occurred because of false brethren secretly brought in (who came in by stealth to spy out our liberty which we have in Christ Jesus, that they might bring us into bondage), to whom we did not yield submission even for an hour, that the truth of the gospel might continue in you."

Avoid and resist any form of legalism designed to place believers into bondage or destroy their liberty in Christ.

If your salvation is dependent upon rites and rituals, traditions of men, church ordinances, doctrinal positions or your own endeavors --- then your God is too small.






